fugitive cossack captain brashly led seven cohorts into a mutinous garrison at manchuli a squalid bordertown on russia s frontier with manchuria the garrison had gone red revolted against its officers and become a dangerous ill disciplined mob nevertheless cossack captain grigori semionov cleverly harangued the garrison into laying down its arms and boarding a train that carried it back into the bolsheviks tenuous territory through such bold action semionov and a handful of young cossack brethren established themselves as the warlords of eastern siberia and russia s pacific maritime provinces during the next bloody year like inland pirates they menaced the trans siberian railroad with fleets of armoured trains cossack cavalry mercenaries and pressgang cannon fodder they undermined admiral kolchak's white armies ruthlessly liquidated all reds terrorized the population sold out to the japanese and antagonized the american expeditionary force and czech legion in a frenzied orchestration of the russian empire s gotterdammerung historians have long recognized that ataman semionov and company were a nasty lot this book details precisely how nasty they were

this volume offers a collection of essays useful for analyzing and comparing terrorist movements especially in relation to islamic terrorism but its scope goes well beyond that offering theoretical insights into the concept of terrorism debating the puzzling phenomenon from various traditions

of thought including analyses of writings by jürgen habermas michael walzer and eric weil it examines the uses of violence by terrorism the who the how and the when present day terrorism is a modern phenomenon to be distinguished from classical insurgency revolution guerrilla warfare or coups d état it is mainly directed at modern societies whether from a religious fundamentalist point of view or from radical social and ecological movements in short terrorism uses largely fabricated ways of thought for political polemological ends in terrorism politics religion literature the reader will find plenty of food for thought as the chapters span a wide range of approaches including manifestos film and literature it will be of particular interest to observers scholars students military personnel journalists and government analysts

the secret agent 1907 is a compelling tale of espionage and terrorism set in edwardian london ironically subtitled a simple tale it paints a terrifying portrait of revolutionaries and anarchists whose personal lives are as barren and futile as their public acts of violence it concludes with the unwitting accomplice of a would be terrorist blowing himself to bits with his own bomb the terrorist s subsequent murder by his own wife and the wife s own suicide this new edition is based on a painstaking comparison of the original manuscript of the work with its first truncated appearance in the american magazine ridgeway s a militant weekly for god and country and with all subsequent book form publications overseen by conrad himself the result is a new text purged of the printers errors and editorial interventions that have been reproduced in all previous printings there is also a critical introduction an essay on the text a textual apparatus and helpful explanatory notes
